*Ethical Issues Arising During Litigation*

She is presently serving as the chair of the Chicago Bar Association Committee on Professional Responsibility. *How to Get More Ethics and Less Corruption In Government*

David Hoffman is a partner at Sidley, Austin. He served as the Inspector General for the City of Chicago for four years, where he transformed the office into an active and independent office that investigated fraud, corruption and waste related to City government. Before that, Mr. Hoffman was an Assistant U.S. Attorney in Chicago, where he prosecuted fraud and corruption, supervised the office's Gang Unit, and played a leading role in the office's anti-gun-violence efforts. Mr. Hoffman clerked for U.S. Supreme Court Chief Justice William Rehnquist after graduating from the University of Chicago Law School, where he currently teaches a course on public corruption. Mr. Hoffman has served on the Illinois Reform Commission, an independent commission created to recommend ethics and anti-corruption reforms in state government. He received the Champion of the Public Interest in 2010 from BPI. In 2010, Mr. Hoffman was a candidate for the U.S. Senate, placing second in the Democratic primary. Mr. Hoffman will share with us his unique perspective of ethics in government.
