What do you love about being a privacy professional?

Having a basic understanding of corporate finance, business strategy and marketing will make you a more well-rounded privacy professional and likely a better partner for your business colleagues.

What was the best professional advice you received?

"If you don't ask, you don't get." I think the biggest limitations in our careers are the ones we create for ourselves. If you had asked me 10 years ago if I would be leading privacy and AI governance at a multinational technology company, I would have said "absolutely!" This may not be the answer you were expecting to read as these answers usually end with "never in my wildest dreams." No one is ever fully ready for their next big move. This is definitely true in fast-moving legal and technological domains. If there is a great opportunity, make it known you want it. Sure, this creates vulnerability, as you may not be given the opportunity. However, it may also lead to your next major role. It is important to see big things for yourself, even if it is not something you can take on today. It forces you to think about what is needed to get you there, which in turn creates action. Strategy is important, but action eats it for breakfast.

What privacy development are you paying attention to this month?

I'm all over AI agents. It is a super exciting area that is THE hot topic in AI at the moment. For those not familiar, a quick YouTube search brings up some excellent videos offered by leading AI companies and institutions such as Y-combinator and Stanford. It would be amazing if it could take over booking my travel for 2025!

What do you do to unwind?
